No.Health.175/2024/Pt/5. - Whereas the Government of Meghalaya, through the Health & Family Welfare Department, bears the constitutional and statutory responsibility of ensuring access to affordable, equitable and quality healthcare services to the residents of the State;

And whereas the public health infrastructure of the State is continuously being strengthened through establishment of Government hospitals, medical colleges and health institutions, yet the demand for specialized and affordable healthcare services continues to exceed the available capacity in several regions;

And whereas a number of charitable and not-for-profit hospitals operating within the State have, over the years, rendered substantial service to the people of Meghalaya, particularly in providing subsidized treatment, inpatient care and outpatient services, thereby supplementing the efforts of the Government in delivery of healthcare services;

And whereas these charitable institutions, by virtue of their service orientation and community engagement, constitute important stakeholders in the State's healthcare ecosystem, particularly in remote and underserved areas where access to medical care remains limited;

And whereas it has been observed that strengthening collaboration between the Government health system and such charitable hospitals would significantly improve the availability, accessibility and efficiency of healthcare delivery, while ensuring that the benefits of subsidized and charitable healthcare continue to reach the intended population;

And whereas the Government considers it expedient, in the larger public interest, to initiate a framework for structured collaboration with such institutions through a pilot initiative under the ongoing "Meghalaya Health Advancement Policy".

And whereas, the Government recognizes that charitable hospitals frequently operate under resource constraints, particularly with respect to availability of qualified doctors. Despite such constraints, these institutions continue to provide subsidized healthcare services to a large number of patients, thereby reducing the burden on Government hospitals.

In view of this, the State Government considers it appropriate to provide limited financial support in the form of remuneration for doctors willing to serve in such charitable hospitals, as a short-term measure aimed at strengthening healthcare access without creating permanent financial liabilities for the Government.

This arrangement shall:

- Enable optimal utilization of medical manpower both bonded and non-bonded within the State.
- Improve access to healthcare services for underserved populations;
- Strengthen collaboration between public and charitable health institutions; and
- Serve as a pilot initiative to evaluate the feasibility of structured public-charitable partnerships in the health sector.

Nature of Engagement: Applications shall be invited from willing doctors, including both bonded and non-bonded doctors, who are interested in serving in identified charitable hospitals under the Meghalaya Health Advancement Policy.

Such engagement shall be purely voluntary and time-bound, and shall be undertaken as part of a pilot initiative of the Health & Family Welfare Department.

The remuneration payable to such doctors shall be equivalent to the remuneration currently paid to contractual Medical and Health Officers (MNHOS) engaged by the Government.

The positions created under this initiative shall be non-transferable and institution-specific, and shall be limited only to recognized charitable and not-for-profit hospitals approved under the policy.

The arrangement shall not constitute regular Government appointment or creation of permanent posts, and shall be reviewed periodically based on service requirements and policy evaluation.

This initiative is conceived strictly in furtherance of the State's obligation to improve healthcare accessibility, particularly for vulnerable populations who depend on subsidized or charitable healthcare services.

By supporting the deployment of doctors in such institutions, the Government seeks to:

- Expand the reach of qualified medical services;
- Reduce patient load on Government hospitals;
- Promote equitable access to healthcare; and
- Encourage collaborative healthcare delivery models within the State.

The Government is satisfied that the proposed collaboration with charitable hospitals under the Meghalaya Health Advancement Policy is reasonable, necessary and in the larger public interest, and that the temporary engagement of willing doctors with Government-supported remuneration will contribute meaningfully to strengthening the State's healthcare delivery system.

As a pilot project, this initiative under the Meghalaya Health Advancement Policy may be started in underserved Garo Hill region in a charitable and non-profit Tertiary care Hospital with significant patient load of more than 30,000 OPD, 4000 IPD, OBGY Surgeries 500 and General surgeries 1200 per calendar year.

No.Health.104/2026/1.- In order to streamline implementation, strengthen convergence across programmes, ensure optimal utilisation of resources, and avoid duplication of efforts, the Health & Family Welfare Department hereby establishes a **Convergence, Accountability and Monitoring Framework for activities undertaken under RMNCH, CPHC, HRH, Gender & Community Mobilisation, and Digital Health including integration with the Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission:**

1. This framework shall apply to all concerned entities under the Department including the National Health Mission, State Health Systems Resource Centre, the Directorates of Health Services, Meghalaya Medical Drugs and Services Limited, Meghalaya Health Insurance Scheme, Meghalaya Health Systems Strengthening Project, and other implementing or technical units as may be identified by the Department from time to time.
2. Designated officers from the above entities are mapped against specific thematic areas and activities to facilitate coordinated planning, implementation and monitoring. The officers so identified are responsible for ensuring convergence of programme activities and for achieving the agreed outputs under their respective thematic areas.
3. Each identified thematic team shall conduct weekly internal review meetings to assess progress, coordinate activities and resolve operational issues. A brief record of discussions and action points shall be maintained.
4. A Monthly Review Meeting shall be conducted by the Mission Director, NHM to review progress across thematic areas, assess performance against agreed deliverables, and address inter-entity coordination issues. Observations and directions issued during such reviews shall be binding and compliance shall be monitored.
5. All Heads of Directorates, Missions, Societies and implementing agencies under the Health & Family Welfare Department shall ensure that programme activities are not undertaken in silos and that there is effective collaboration and coordination among the concerned entities.
6. The activity-wise mapping of responsibilities is placed at **Appendix-I** to this Notification.
7. The personnel indicated in **Appendix-I** shall be primarily responsible for coordination, implementation and reporting of the mapped activities. However, the responsibility for achieving the intended outputs shall not be limited to the individuals listed, and all concerned officers and units shall extend necessary support as required.
8. The activities, responsibilities and designated personnel under this framework may be reviewed and updated from time to time by the Department based on programmatic requirements and emerging priorities.
9. This Notification shall come into force with immediate effect, and all concerned shall ensure strict compliance.

Subject:- Service Conditions of Regularised Adhoc Employees-Seniority and Promotion thereof.

1. Whereas, the Cabinet on 15th March, 2022 and 10th January, 2025 had approved to regularize 3635 and 859 adhoc employees who were appointed on or before 31st December, 2007. The Cabinet decision reads as follows:

"The Cabinet approved the regularization of 3635 and 859 Group C & Group D adhoc employees, subject to the conditions that the regularization is:

- (i) Against sanctioned posts only.
- (ii) For only adhoc appointments made on or before 31st December, 2007.
- (iii) Subject to Rules and Regulations.
- (iv) Applies prospectively from the date of issue of order and after the Adhoc employee has undergone the special examination/interview conducted specifically for this purpose by the Meghalaya Public Service Commission or the District Selection Committee/Departmental Selection Committee concerned.

The pensionary benefits etc., for these adhoc employees approved for regularization by the Cabinet have been covered by O.M. No.PER (AR) 34/2006/Pt.V/1, dated 21st December, 2022.

2. Whereas, the Government in Personnel & AR (B) Department had examined the cases with regards to the promotions and seniority of those adhoc appointees who were appointed before 31st December, 2007 and whose services were approved for regularisation and, hence, found it necessary to issue the following instructions for promotion and seniority as stated below:-
 - (a) Whereas for those adhoc appointees whose services were approved for regularisation by the Cabinet's decision and where their promotions had earlier been given prior to regularisation on the recommendation of concerned Departmental Promotion Committee and that these promotions also adhered and aligned to the mandate of the relevant Service Rules in terms of the schedule and hierarchy of posts as spelled out in the relevant Service Rules, the promotions of such adhoc appointees shall be condoned and their seniority shall be considered as junior to the junior most incumbent in position,
 - (b) Whereas for those adhoc appointees whose services were approved for regularisation by the Cabinet's decision and where the promotions were accorded without the sitting and recommendation of the Departmental Promotion Committees as per relevant Service Rules and where these promotions which were accorded do not adhere and align with the mandate of relevant Service Rules in terms of the schedule and hierarchy of posts, the promotions of such adhoc appointees shall not be condoned and they will be reverted to the post where they were regularized (initial post) and the period spent in the higher post shall be treated as officiating period only. Further, their seniority shall be considered as junior to the junior most incumbent in the post regularised (initial post).
 - (c) The instructions laid down in Paragraph 2(a) and Paragraph 2(b) above shall also be applicable to those adhoc employees from the list of 3635 numbers and 859 numbers of regularized adhoc employees who have already retired or have expired.

- (3) It shall apply to all Non-Government Schools and Colleges and to all employees to whom the Act applies.

**Amendment
of Section 4**

- (4) Sub-section (3) of Section 4 of the Principal Scheme shall be omitted and substituted as follows:
"(3) The Board shall consist of the following members, namely:—
 - (i) four nominees of the State Government, not below such rank as may be specified by the Government, one of whom shall be designated as the Chairman of the Board;
 - (ii) five representatives of the employees, to be nominated in such manner as may be notified by the Government, of whom at least—
 - a) one shall represent aided colleges,
 - b) one shall represent secondary schools, and
 - c) one shall represent elementary schools;
 - (iii) one member having special knowledge or professional experience in banking, finance, investment, actuarial science, pension fund management or capital markets, to be nominated by the State Government.
- (5) In sub-section (4) of Section 4 of the Principal Scheme shall be omitted and substituted as follows:
 - (4) The total strength of the Board shall be ten members."
