No.MPCB/TB/INV-3/2016/2026-2027/32. - Whereas, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Government of India, has issued Notification No. G.S.R. 761(E) dated 17th October, 2025 amending Notification No. G.S.R. 702(E) dated 12th November, 2024 with respect to the list of White Category industrial sectors; And whereas, the Meghalaya State Pollution Control Board, in its 95th Board Meeting held on 13th May, 2026, vide Agenda Item No. 5, resolved to adopt the revised list of White Category industrial sectors as enclosed herewith;

Now, therefore, the Meghalaya State Pollution Control Board hereby notifies that the 86 (eighty-six) industrial sectors classified under the White Category shall be exempted from obtaining Consent to Establish (CTE) and Consent to Operate (CTO) under the provisions of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Amendment Act, 2024 and the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Amendment Act, 2024.

This notification shall come into force with immediate effect.

1. It will also facilitate engagement with district and Gram Panchayat institutions for timely execution of schemes and adherence to service delivery standards.
2. The SWSM shall conduct monthly review meetings and upload the Minutes of the Meeting (MoM) on the SWSM Dashboard through the JJM-IMIS portal.
3. To institutionalize coordination with NJJM through regular interactions between the Mission Director, NJJM, and State Mission Director. Monthly review meetings, joint monitoring, and digital platforms for real-time data sharing will support aligned planning, reform implementation, and data-driven governance.
4. The Executive Committee will be supported by the State Programme Management Unit (SPMU) to provide technical, managerial, and administrative support for planning, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of the Mission. The SPMU will also support data-driven decisionmaking, inter-departmental coordination, and adherence to service delivery standards.

"41 A.- "Production of non-alcoholic malt beverages within a brewery premises.- (1) The Commissioner of Excise, Meghalaya, may permit a brewery to produce non-alcoholic malt beverages (NABs) having alcoholic strength not exceeding 0.5% v/v (0.88 degree proof), as defined by FSSAI standards, within the approved brewery premises, after such enquiry as deemed necessary and on receipt of a declaration from the brewer that such production shall not hamper the usual course of beer production;

(2) For this purpose, the brewery may install apparatus and make necessary process alterations with prior approval of the Commissioner of Excise, within the approved premises, excluding storage and dispatch facility for Non-Alcoholic Malt Beverages which shall be located outside the approved area;

(3) The brewer shall notify the District Excise Officer prior to commencement and shall ensure that brewery operation for such Non-Alcoholic Malt Beverages production is entirely exhausted in producing that category only,

(4) The ethanol extracted in the process of manufacturing Non Alcoholic Malt Beverages through de-alcoholization process by means of boiling point distillation or osmosis or reverse osmosis and any other such process which separates ethanol from the Beer, shall be stored separately in the Brewery premises under the supervision of Brewery Officer, and shall be sold to potable alcohol manufacturing companies or companies using industrial alcohol for manufacturing chemicals, pharmaceuticals, cosmetics, fuel etc.

(5) For this purpose, the brewery may install required apparatus and make necessary addition-alteration with prior approval of the Commissioner of Excise within the approved Brewery premises, including the storage and dispatch facility for non-alcoholic malt beverages which shall be situated within the approved area;

(6) The Brewery permitted to manufacture Non-Alcoholic Malt Beverages shall pay a privilege fee of Re. 0.50 paise per Bulk Litre calculated on the volume of Beer receive for production of Non-Alcoholic Malt Beverages in such manner as prescribed by the Commissioner of Excise;

(7) The Commissioner of Excise, Meghalaya, Shillong may issue suitable guidelines for such purpose from time to time;

(8) Label requirements; Every label and Mono carton shall bear the following

(i) Name of product and description "Non-Alcoholic Beer" or "Alcohol-Free Malt Beverage"

(ii) Alcohol content by volume (e.g., "0.0% ABV" or "<0.5% ABV").

(iii) FSSAI license number.

(iv) Batch number, date of manufacture, and expiry Date.

(v) Labels must not mislead consumers by implying intoxicating effects.

(9) Accounting.-

- (i) Manufacturers shall maintain accurate production, sales, and stock registers in prescribed format both in hard and soft copy.
- (ii) Records shall be retained for a minimum of five years and be made available to the licensing Authority upon inspection."

5. The payment on account of the Dearness Allowance/Dearness Relief sanctioned herein shall be debited to the respective heads of accounts from which the employees draw their salary and the pensioners/family pension holders, their pension.

No.EDN.104/2024/240. - Whereas, the Government of Meghalaya had notified the "Meghalaya Non-Government Schools and Colleges Employees Centralised Provident Fund Scheme, 2026" *vide* notification No.EDN.104/2024/194 dated 18th March, 2026 and Notification EDN.104/2024/205 dated 9th April, 2026 in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 4(1) of the Meghalaya Non-Government Schools and Colleges Employees Centralised Provident Fund Act, 1969, for ensuring long-term financial security and social protection of employees of non-Government schools and colleges in the State;

And whereas, several retired deficit school and college employees have represented before the Government seeking permission to withdraw the full amount accrued in their respective CPF accounts on account of financial, medical and personal exigencies;

And whereas, certain in-service deficit school and college employees have also represented before the Government seeking an option not to subscribe to the CPF Scheme and instead invest their savings in other financial or pension instruments of their choice;

And whereas, the Government has examined the provisions of the Meghalaya Non-Government Schools and Colleges Employees Centralised Provident Fund Act, 1969 and the Meghalaya Non-Government Schools and Colleges Employees Centralised Provident Fund Scheme, 2026, and observed that neither the Act nor the Scheme mandates compulsory subscription by all deficit school and college employees, and that the Scheme principally provides an enabling framework for provident fund and retirement benefit administration;

And whereas, the Government considers it necessary, in the interest of fairness, informed consent and financial autonomy of employees, to provide an option to eligible employees to opt out of the Scheme, subject to appropriate safeguards and informed undertaking;

Now, therefore, the Governor of Meghalaya is pleased to order as follows:—

1. Option for retired employees to opt out of CPF Scheme

Retired deficit school and college employees shall be permitted to opt out of the Meghalaya Non-Government Schools and Colleges Employees Centralised Provident Fund Scheme, 2026 and withdraw 100% of the amount accrued in their respective CPF accounts. Applications for such withdrawal shall be submitted in the prescribed Form-I appended to this Notification.

2. Verification and authorization

Upon receipt of the application:

- (i) the Directorate of School Education & Literacy (DSEL) shall verify the claims and issue authorisation in respect of deficit school employees; and
- (ii) the Directorate of Higher & Technical Education (DHTE) shall verify the claims and issue authorisation in respect of college employees.

Only upon issuance of such authorisation shall the State Bank of India, Laitumkhrah Branch, Shillong permit withdrawal from the Central CPF Account, namely, the Meghalaya Non-Government Teachers EPF Account.

For the purpose of facilitating verification and authorisation, the SBI, Laitumkhrah Branch shall furnish to the concerned Directorates a statement containing:

- the total amount deposited in the Central CPF Account; and
- employee-wise particulars of the amounts standing to the credit of each employee.

3. Mandatory financial counselling before withdrawal

Before permitting withdrawal of the accumulated CPF amount, the Branch Manager, SBI, Laitumkhrah Branch shall mandatorily explain to the retired employee:

- (i). the estimated monthly pension likely to accrue under the best available annuity scheme in the event of annuitisation of 50% of the accumulated corpus and withdrawal of the remaining 50%; and
- (ii). the long-term financial implications of opting out of the annuity-based pension framework.

4. Undertaking by retired employees

After such explanation, the retired employee shall submit an undertaking stating that:

- (i) he/she has been fully informed of the pensionary benefits available under the annuity option;
- (ii) he/she is fully aware of the financial implications of withdrawing the entire accumulated amount; and
- (iii) he/she voluntarily opts out of the CPF Scheme and seeks withdrawal of the entire accrued amount.

Upon submission of such undertaking, the employee shall be permitted to withdraw the full CPF amount standing to his/her credit.

5. Option for in-service employees

In-service employees of deficit schools and colleges shall also be permitted to opt out of the CPF Scheme and invest in any other financial, pension or retirement scheme of their choice. All such employees shall submit applications in the prescribed Form-IA appended to this Notification.

Upon receipt of such application:

- (i) the Directorate of School Education & Literacy (DSEL) shall verify and issue authorisation in respect of deficit school employees; and
- (ii) the Directorate of Higher & Technical Education (DHTE) shall verify and issue authorisation in respect of college employees.

6. Mandatory awareness and undertaking for in-service employees

Before withdrawal of their CPF accumulation, such employees shall:

- (i) be informed by the concerned SBI Branch regarding the benefits available under the CPF Scheme and annuity-based pension options;
- (ii) be made aware of the possible long-term financial implications of opting out of the Scheme; and
- (iii) submit an undertaking stating that the decision to opt out has been taken voluntarily and with full understanding of its implications and consequences.

7. Effect of opting out

Employees opting out of the CPF Scheme under this Notification shall not thereafter be entitled to claim any benefit under the Scheme, except such accrued benefits as may already have vested prior to opting out.

Such employees shall withdraw the entire amount standing to their credit from the Central CPF Account, and thereafter the monthly CPF contribution amount shall be released along with salary into their salary account or such other bank account as may be specified by the employee.

8. Employees opting for the CPF Scheme

Employees of deficit schools and colleges who opt for the Meghalaya Non-Government Schools and Colleges Employees Centralised Provident Fund Scheme, 2026 shall open a Permanent Retirement Account Number (PRAN) through the designated branches of the State Bank of India and furnish the same to the concerned Directorate, namely:

- (i) the Directorate of School Education & Literacy (DSEL), in respect of deficit school employees; and
- (ii) the Directorate of Higher & Technical Education (DHTE), in respect of college employees.

Upon receipt and verification of the PRAN details, the accumulated CPF contribution standing to the credit of such employees in the Central CPF Account maintained at SBI, Laitumkhrah Branch shall be transferred to their respective PRAN accounts in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.

After completion of:

- (a) transfer of accumulated CPF amounts to the PRAN accounts of employees continuing under the Scheme; and
- (b) withdrawal of CPF accumulations by employees opting out of the Scheme, the Central CPF Account maintained at SBI, Laitumkhrah Branch, Shillong shall be closed and no further transactions shall thereafter be carried out through the said account.

9. Interpretation

If any difficulty arises in the implementation or interpretation of this Notification, the matter shall be referred to the Education Department, Government of Meghalaya, whose decision thereon shall be final.
